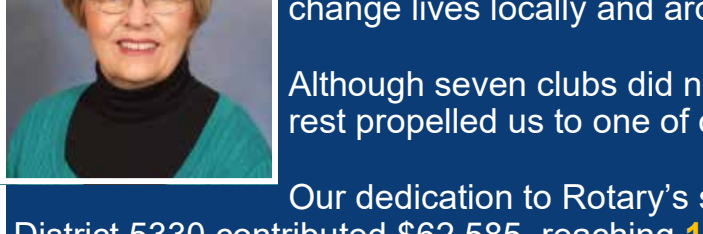
GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE

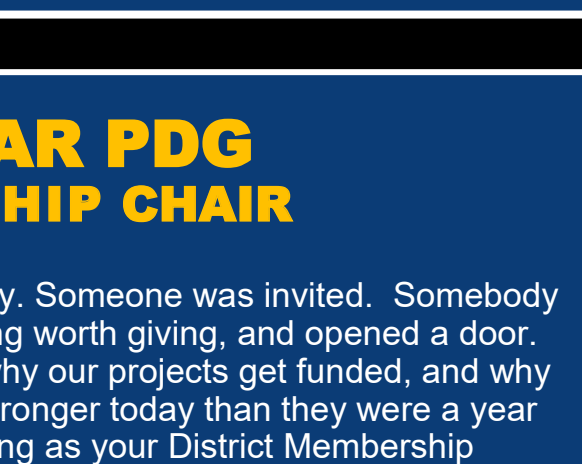

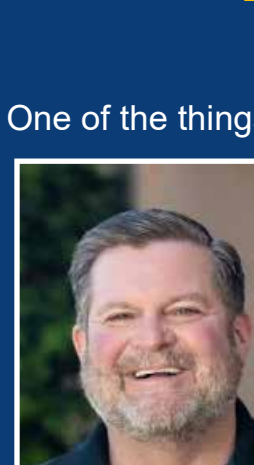

In 2025-2026, District 5330 delivered an exceptional year of generosity and impact. Our clubs contributed an impressive **\$343,639** to the Annual Fund—an extraordinary **249.5% of goal**. This achievement reflects the strength of our district and the commitment of Rotarians who continue to invest in projects that change lives locally and around the world.

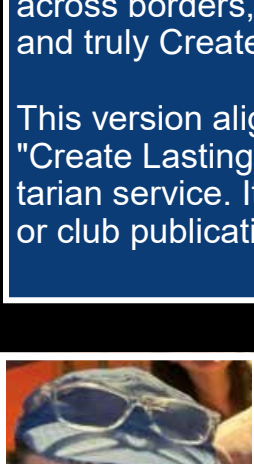
Although seven clubs did not contribute, the overwhelming participation of the rest propelled us to one of our strongest fundraising years yet.

Our dedication to Rotary's signature cause, **PolioPlus**, was equally inspiring. District 5330 contributed \$62,585, reaching **182.3% of goal** and reinforcing our commitment to ending polio for good. While 20 clubs did not contribute, the generosity of the participating clubs demonstrates how deeply our district believes in finishing the job Rotary began decades ago.

As we celebrate these remarkable accomplishments, we also see an exciting opportunity ahead. Imagine the impact we could make if every club in District 5330 participated. The clubs that were unable to contribute last year are warmly invited to join in this effort—your support, at any level, will help make our results even more spectacular. Together, we can strengthen our district, expand our reach, and amplify the good we do in communities near and far.

District 5330 is a force for good—driven by service, united by purpose, and ready to achieve even greater heights when every club lends its voice and its heart.

That single act is why our clubs exist, why our projects get funded, and why communities across District 5330 are stronger today than they were a year ago. This year I have the honor of serving as your District Membership Chair, and I do not serve alone.

Everyone is welcome, and we strongly encourage every membership chair and committee to join us for best practices, useful tools, the latest updates, and leads coming from District and Rotary International outreach.

Rotary International President Yinka Babalola has called on us to reach 1.25 million Rotarians by Rotary 125th anniversary. That goal will not be met in a boardroom. It will be met in our clubs, one invitation at a time.
